Raphael Almagor-Cohen

Rafi is Professor/Chair in Politics, University of Hull and received his DPhil in political theory from Oxford University (1992). He has published 17 books and more than 200 papers in the fields of political science, media, philosophy, law and ethics. Professor Cohen-Almagor is now writing two books, one on the failed peace process between Israel and the PLO, and another tentatively titled *Reasonable Multiculturalism*. He is the author of a widely read and often cited blog about politics in the Mideast called "ISRAEL: Democracy, Human Rights, Politics and Society."
